Going Bach to Luther

During March, as we enter the penitential season of Lent, we will focus on Luther's setting of Psalm 130, "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee." (LSB 607) Luther, who wrote both the words and music, wrote this hymn between 1523 and 1524 and it appeared in the first Lutheran hymnal in 1524. Psalm 130 was a favorite psalm of Luther and in 1525, Luther wrote that he wished that more poets would write hymn texts based on the psalms, not to use flowery language, but simple wording that the people could understand, and still stay true to the psalm text. Luther took special pains to work on this setting of Psalm 130 and sent it as an example for other poets to follow. It quickly became a favorite and was sung at the funeral of Elector Frederick the Wise, a person so important to Luther, in 1525, as well as Luther's own funeral in 1546. It is said that Luther during the Diet of Augsburg in 1530, which Luther couldn't attend because he was considered a criminal at the time, gathered his servants together to sing this hymn, saying, "Come, let us, despite the devil, sing "From Depths of Woe" and thereby praise and glorify God." The melody, with its large vocal jump in the first three notes show Luther the composer again, the cry, reaching into the depths of woe itself. The text of "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee" focuses on the sorrow we feel for our sins, and our hope in the forgiveness of Christ. The hymn continues by emphasizing that we can do nothing to earn God's forgiveness, but God's mercy towards us is a free gift. The final stanza expresses trust that the grace of God is greater than our sins and that He will redeem us in the end.
