Some Notes and Explanation of our Liturgy – Part 1

Our liturgy is a gift that we use every week as we worship. The roots of our liturgy can be traced back to before the birth of Christ, and it has taken shape over many years. The music may change from season to season or from hymnbook to hymnbook, but the worship texts teach us so much. Let's look at the beginning of our liturgy:



INVOCATION – we begin each week calling on the name of our Triune God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Where God's name is, there He is also, sharing His gifts with us. We are then reminded by the pastor of the sign of the cross, which we can also trace upon ourselves, as a reminder that we were marked with the sign of the cross as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION – We acknowledge that we have been born sinful and we admit the actual sins that we have committed to God. To absolve means to clear of blame or guilt. Jesus commissioned his ministers to forgive or retain the sins of the people. The pastor announces to us, in the place and by the command of Jesus the good news that our sins are absolved.

KYRIE, GLORY TO GOD, THIS IS THE FEAST – As forgiven people of God, we then sing to our Lord. Depending on the season, we sing one of these options. The KYRIE (from the Greek, kyrie eleison, or Lord have mercy) is a prayer, not for forgiveness, our sins have already been forgiven in the confession/absolution, rather it is a prayer asking for God's guidance and help. In the hymn of praise GLORY TO GOD, we continue the angel's hymn in this elaboration of their song at Christmas praising God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. THIS IS THE FEAST takes its content from the book of Revelation. It is, as it says, a song of the victory of Christ the Lamb, our crucified, risen and ascended Lord. It gives us a glimpse of His heavenly kingdom, which has been promised to us.

We are proud to introduce our 2017-2018 Bible Verse: But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." Galatians 5:22-23 There are many great events, activities and new collaborative programs that we are implementing this fall. Here at Trinity we continue to prepare our students for an ever changing world; it is imperative in creating a well-rounded 21st Century Christian Scholar. This year we promise to continue in creating the optimum learning environment.





Confirmation is a rite of the church to assist parents in fulfilling the promises that were made at a child's Baptism to be faithful, active participants of faith. Confirmation is not a sacrament as is Holy Communion and Holy Baptism, but a cooperative learning time of preparation, knowledge and growth.

We at Trinity are excited to share our new Confirmation Program, staff and ideas with you.

Confirmation instruction will be headed by Pastor Hopkins, who will be teaching Confirmation I (grade 6) in the evening. Mrs. Jen Gallo will instruct our school member children. Deacon Vergara will instruct our Confirmation II children (grade 7) in the evening and Jen Gallo will instruct our school church member children. Mrs. Erika Skoch, a Called teacher at Trinity will instruct both the evening and school member children for Confirmation III (grade 8). We have many new changes to our program. We will be meeting on Thursday evenings for public school children beginning at 7:15-8:30. We also will be incorporating a number of service projects as well.

We will be asking you to prayerfully consider sponsoring a confirmand so watch for more information to come. A new school year is approaching and we are all so excited!! We are planning on doing something new this year. Starting in September, V.O.T.Y. will be piggy-backing Sunday School. Our Community Garden is located on the backside of our school's playground, next to the Christmas Tree Lot. It is most easily accessed through the main gates at 46 W. Cherry Street. We are in our seventh growing season, and continue to grow, no pun intended, every year. We started out with 33 raised beds, and a lot of empty space. We now have 33 raised beds, four fruit trees, four compost bins, four picnic tables, two benches, a shed, sink and produce cleaning station, a beautiful sign, a gravel driveway and coming soon, a greenhouse!

All of this has been accomplished through volunteer help and generous donations and grants. We do this work to fulfill the mission that was created in 2011 – "Growing in faith with the community to bring food to the hungry as an expression of God's love."

All our produce is donated, through various groups and agencies, to those in need throughout our neighboring communities. From larger agencies such as LI Cares, to neighbors of our volunteers. Hundreds of pounds of food have gone out to serve the most important need we all have, being fed. We are feeding people both physically and spiritually, both those we serve, and those who come to volunteer with us.

Come down to the garden any Monday night at 6:30 pm and you will see little kids working with their parents, and teenagers earning community service hours, and folks giving up their free time to do dirty, sweaty work, and do it joyfully. They know they are making a difference, they know they are having a very immediate impact, and they walk out of there feeling satisfied.



So far this growing season we have donated over 150 pounds of food. We will be growing until October, so that number will be much larger by the time we are finished for the year. But we want to do more! We want to plant more beds, we want to plant more fruit trees, we want to plant blueberry bushes! We need more hands to make that possible. Our garden is large, about 18,000 square feet of property to plant, harvest and maintain. We need you!! Come by one night to experience it for yourself, then you too can share in that feeling of satisfaction.






Mandy's Mark - The New York Chapter of The Cure Starts Now was formed in honor of Amanda "Mandy" Kuck who was diagnosed with Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG) on June 6, 2015. DIPG is an extremely rare tumor affecting approximately 300 children a year. DIPG affects the pons portion of the brainstem, rendering nervous system functions impossible. Mandy's parents discovered that since this disease, like most childhood cancers, was considered "rare," there was little or no government funding to pay for the research needed to find answers. DIPG receives a miniscule slice of the 4% of research funding allocated for all pediatric cancers by the National Cancer Institute.

That day, Mandy's parents were given staggering statistics about median survival ranging from 9 to 12 months; children with DIPG have a less than 10% chance of surviving 2 years. Mandy underwent 6 weeks of radiation therapy at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. Sadly, Mandy earned her angel wings on January 25, 2016.

Mandy was courageous, easy-going, thoughtful, kind, helpful, confident and reliable. Although timid at first, once she let you in, she wouldn't let go. She idolized her big brother and loved babies, possessing an innate motherly instinct. Even when she could not communicate, she taught us to be strong. To be brave. To fight for what we want. That it's okay to be strong-willed and stubborn. To not be afraid to be yourself. Her parents are so proud of Mandy and the mark she continues to leave on all those she's touched! "We are beyond blessed to have been chosen to be Mandy's parents and will forever remain awed by her strength, faith and resiliency".
