

Welcome

Our world enjoys labeling people. Whether by skin color, gender, economic status, ethnic background, political affiliation, age, or whatever else it may be, labels are popular. This sort of labeling divides people into categories and causes much strife and argument. There was labeling going on in Colossae as well: Greek, Jew, circumcised, uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free. But in Colossians, Paul gives us a label that we share and a label that leads not to divisive evil but to amazing generosity and love. Paul writes, "You have been raised with Christ." Imagine that. He doesn't say that you will one day in the future be raised with Christ (although that is also true), he says, "You have been raised with Christ." That is the label we are marked with in Holy Baptism. This comes to us by grace and calls forth from us a life abundant with generosity.

Holy Communion

We believe that Christ's body and blood are truly present in Holy Communion, and that we receive the forgiveness of sins along with the bread and wine in this Holy Meal. 

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-26

Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an unhappy business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after wind.

I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. So I turned about and gave my heart up to despair over all the toil of my labors under the sun, because sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

There is nothing better for a person than that he should eat and drink and find enjoyment in his toil. This also, I saw, is from the hand of God, for apart from him who can eat or who can have enjoyment? For to the one who pleases him God has given wisdom and knowledge and joy, but to the sinner he has given the business of gathering and collecting, only to give to one who pleases God. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.

EPISTLE Colossians 3:1-11



Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.



Notes about Today's Music

Today's prelude is Dieterich Buxtehude's Praeludium in C Major. Buxtehude lived from 1637 to 1707, spending the majority of his career at the Marienkirche in Luebeck, Germany. This composition is very typical of North German music of the time. It begins with a short prelude with some long pedal solos and fast keyboard flourishes. There is then a quieter, imitative section. The composition ends with a musical form known as a Chaconne, a set of variations over a repeated melody on the pedals. Buxtehude was a giant in Lutheran church music and many famous musicians, (Handel, Telemann and Bach to name a few) would travel great distances to learn from the master. Buxtehude, the story goes, would look for a successor for his position at the Marienkirche, however, whoever took the job must also marry Buxtehude's daughter. There were no takers among the famed musicians of the day.

During the offering we will be reminded of the melody for today's last hymn, "Praise the Almighty, My Soul, Adore Him" (LSB 797). This arrangement is written by Jan Bender, a Lutheran composer, well known in Germany, he became a composer for Concordia Publishing House and in the 1960's, moved to the U.S. and went on to teach both at Concordia College, Seward, NE and Wittenberg University in Ohio.

The postlude, Toccata on Deo Gratias, is a virtuosic piece by Richard Keys Biggs (1886-1962) who spent the majority of his career as an organist in Hollywood, CA. The piece is based on the last congregational response said in our service, *Go in peace, serve the Lord - Thanks Be to God.* The melody is an ancient melody used with those words. The toccata is an exuberant piece sending us off, after hearing God's Word, to serve Him in the world.
